This is a service of Holy Communion. All baptized persons are welcome to receive; anyone who is not baptized may come forward for a blessing. The bread (a wafer) will be placed in your hand. Take a cup for the wine from the tray, returning it to the empty tray. Grape juice is available in the pre-filled cups in the center of the tray. Those attending online are invited to prepare a small bit of bread of any sort, and wine or juice if they are accessible to you, creating sacred space.

Following worship everyone is invited to a champagne reception in our chapel, located behind the chancel. You can get there through either door at the front of the nave.


Great Thanksgiving






